

**PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE TOWN OF CARRBORO  
CONSENTING TO APPLICATION OF THE PROCLAMATION  
OF ORANGE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA  
DATED DECEMBER 16, 2020  
WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF CARRBORO**

WHEREAS, Orange County Board of Commissioners Chair Renee Price has signed a Proclamation incorporating the terms of various gubernatorial Executive Orders with some changes and exceptions deemed necessary and specific to Orange County in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Crisis; and


WHEREAS, said proclamation and the restrictions contained therein may be made applicable within the Town of Carrboro's jurisdiction with the consent of the Mayor of Carrboro pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. 166A-19.22(b)(2).

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Lydia E. Lavelle, Mayor of the Town of Carrboro, do hereby proclaim the continued existence of a STATE OF EMERGENCY within the Town of Carrboro, and, pursuant to the authority granted to me by State law and Town ordinance, hereby ORDER as follows:

1. For the reasons and based on the findings stated in the attached Proclamation of the Chair of the Orange County Board of Commissioners, I consent to the application of said Proclamation within the Town of Carrboro pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. 166A-19.22(b)(2).

This Proclamation shall be effective December 17, 2020 at 10:00am (Eastern Daylight Time) and remain in effect through and including March 31, 2021, unless properly rescinded or modified by subsequent Proclamation.
